Tiffany Lamps and Lighting from the Morse Collection

The Museum's refreshed installation of lamps and lighting from Tiffany Studios provides a new setting for some particularly treasured designs always on view and room for the return of such jewels from the vault as a magnificent 28-inch hanging Dogwood design shade, after 1900, and a floor lamp, c. 1902, with a leaded-glass Bamboo design shade. The exhibit has been expanded to include lighting examples by other decorative arts firms.

Focus Exhibition: Tiffany Studios' Daffodil Reading Lamp

From the shape of its base to the decoration of its leaded-glass shade, the Morse Museum's beautiful Daffodil lamp, c. 1899 to 1905, from Tiffany Studios well rewards a careful and thorough examination. Through objects
