Louis Comfort Tiffany's Life and Art

Unless otherwise noted, the objects in this gallery were designed by Louis Comfort Tiffany (1848–1933) or one of his artists and made under the name of one of his companies in New York City. The installation history at various Tiffany residences is stated if known. His Seventy-Second Street house was in New York City, and his country estate Laurelton Hall was on Long Island.
